


The purpose of an oral health surveillance system is to *use data* to monitor and promote oral health.

The Council of State & Territorial Epidemiologists considers a state to have an oral health surveillance system if they have these 10 items.

- Written oral health surveillance plan
- 2 3rd grade oral health data
- Tooth loss data for adults
- 4 Oral cancer data
- Annual dental visit for Medicaid/CHIP

- Annual dental visit for children 1-17 years
- Annual dental visit for adults
- Fluoridation status of public water systems
- Workforce and infrastructure data
- Publicly available & actionable data
