

Georgia Oral Health Summit: 9/20/02

Georgia held an Oral Health Summit September 20, 2002 in Macon, Georgia. More than 130 people participated in the Summit. The broad-based audience of oral health advocates included providers, public health, physicians, community advocates, elected officials, school nurses, educators, and representatives from the business community. An extensive notebook with copies of presentations, guidelines for regional planning workshops, and specific oral health information and resources concerning Georgia and the U.S. were given to each participant. The objectives of the Summit were to: 1) gain an understanding of both general and local dental\ oral health, 2) establish the necessary community-level relationships among stakeholders to enable system building and collaborative activities to develop following the Summit, and 3) develop specific strategies and initial action plans based on local needs that will be acted upon after the Summit. These strategies and plans dealt directly with the issues of improved access to dental services and the expansion of oral health preventive services especially for children. The Georgia Oral Health Team Members of The Policy Academy on Improving Oral Health Access and Outcomes for Children helped plan the Summit and served as facilitators of the Workgroups. Additional support was received from: U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration, Georgia Dental Association, Georgia Association For Primary Health Care, Oral Health America, Georgia Department Of Human Resources, Family Health Section, Georgia Rural Water Association, and the Macon-Bibb County Health Department.

All seven of the regional planning groups plan to continue to address oral health issues when they return to their communities. A small continuation grant will be provided as seed money to continue the regional planning. The Summit evaluations were very positive. The results of the Summit are being distributed for review and comments, and a final report will be shared with Summit participants and interested parties.
