Online and in-person courses, conferences, webinars, workshops, and other learning opportunities

## **National Associations**

<u>Association of State and Territorial Dental Directors:</u> many resources on specific topics, e.g., water fluoridation, health communication, evaluation, are posted on topical webpages that can be accessed via the A-Z tab. Selected ones that require members only sign in are available at <u>ASTDD Webcasts and</u> <u>Audioconferences</u>. Also see the Program and Professional Development and Enhancement webpage.

<u>National Oral Health Conference</u>: the "premier meeting" for those interested in continuing education and networking opportunities within the discipline of Dental Public Health. 2023 will mark the 24th joint meeting of ASTDD and the American Association of Public Health Dentistry (AAPHD). Conference format includes weekend interactive workshops, plenary and concurrent sessions, poster and roundtable sessions, meetings of other groups, and networking opportunities.

<u>American Association of Public Health Dentistry</u>: membership organization whose mission is to provide leadership in ensuring optimal oral health for individuals and communities.

• **Dental Public Health Curriculum:** HRSA-funded project of dental public health competencies and curriculum for use in pre-doctoral dental and dental hygiene programs in the US.

<u>American Dental Association</u>: extensive offering of <u>continuing education</u> offerings, conducting conferences and hosting numerous CE courses or in person across the US or online (seme require membership or subscriptions).

<u>American Dental Hygienists' Association</u>: extensive <u>CE course online catalog</u> for members and nonmembers, some at a cost.

<u>American Evaluation Association</u>: AEA is a professional association of evaluators devoted to the application and exploration of evaluation as a profession. They host an annual Evaluation Conference, Summer Evaluation Institute, and have additional resources and trainings on their website.

<u>American Institute of Dental Public Health</u>: nonprofit organization centering health equity as a cornerstone of oral health education and training. They offer educational training for oral health professionals, support student growth and career development in dental public health and serve as conveners to facilitate systems change in the oral health community. Resources include information on training opportunities, archived colloquium presentations, and a database of more than 2,000 articles, publications, and reports spanning more than 40 topic areas.

<u>Association of State and Territorial Health Officials:</u> has an e-learning center where there are ondemand training modules, learning sprints (short evidence-based learning opportunities designed to improve performance), and previous webinars. <u>Link for online courses</u>.

<u>Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists</u>: posts training and fellowship opportunities and has a <u>learning center</u> (requires that you sign up) with courses, a resource library and community groups.

International Association for Dental Research: hosts multiple conferences globally featuring new research, posts webinars and a CE On Demand library including resources from previous meetings (requires membership). Their American affiliate is the American Association for Dental, Orofacial and Cranial Research.

<u>Medicaid/Medicare/Chip Services Dental Association</u>: mission is to improve oral health for all Medicaid, Medicare, and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) beneficiaries. Learning modules and labs, webinars, presentations, and other resources are available, although a bit dated.

National Association of Chronic Disease Directors learning center: includes general member webinars and Leadership Basics Series: short, self-directed professional leadership and management development opportunities.
