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








What is Teledentistry?





How it all started...



- At NOHC 2011, Dr. Paul Glassman gave a presentation on the Virtual Dental Home model entitled "Welcome to the Future: Using Telehealth Enabled, Geographically Distributed, Collaborative, Oral Health Systems to Improve Oral Health of Underserved Populations.
 - Dentists and allied dental personnel collaborate at a distance
 - Establishes a community based collaborative virtual health home for populations that would otherwise not receive oral health care
 - Brings care to where the people are
 - Allows oral health professionals to work at the top of their profession




The Virtual Dental Home





















Results of Pilot



- Over 700 students received oral health care in their schools
- 53% of students had untreated decay which means 47% of students were able to be "kept healthy" in the community setting



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Using Telehealth Technologies to Improve Oral Health for Vulnerable and Underserved Populations

ABSTRACT Telehealth refers to the use of technology to provide health care at a distance. The important and increasing role of telehealth in the delivery of health care has been recognized for several decades. Although there are fewer reports on the use of telehealth to deliver oral health services, evidence is emerging that these technologies can enhance the ability of the oral health delivery system to reach vulnerable and underserved populations.

Legislative action



 Senate Bill 786 from the 2017 session- requires the **Oregon Board of Dentistry** to allow oral health care providers to use telehealth when dental care provider determines telehealth is appropriate. Requires board to treat provision of dental care service in same manner regardless of method of delivery of dental service.

Compilation of State Laws and Regulations Addressing Teledentistry or Telehealth Conducted by Oral Health Practitioners

States O-W

This document is a compilation of state statutes and regulations that address teledentistry or telehealth conducted by oral health practitioners. Each state's laws and regulations may be divided into three parts: requirements and permissible practices, Medicaid reimbursement and private payer reimbursement. Some states do not address all three of these topic areas and, as a result, a state may have fewer sections.

Because this analysis only focuses on laws as they apply to oral health care providers, it may not include telehealth policies that apply to other groups of health care practitioners.

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








Teledentistry Regulations by State


