ASTDD Basic Screening Survey for Children Planning and Implementation Packet

Guidance on Selecting a Sample For a School-Based Oral Health Survey

Proper sampling design and methods are crucial for valid population estimates and statistical assessments of precision of estimates. This document provides a basic framework for how a sample of schools is selected for school-based oral health surveys. Although geared towards states and territories, the techniques are appropriate for other jurisdictions such as counties.



Guidance on Analyzing Data From a School-Based Oral Health Survey

Available June 2013. The purpose of this document is to provide a basic framework for how to appropriately analyze data from a school-based oral health survey that employed a complex sampling design. This topic is important because standard formulas do not account for unequal sampling weights, stratification or clustering and may result in biased point estimates of population parameters (in an unweighted analysis) and/or underestimation of standard errors for point estimates. To obtain valid point estimates, standard errors, and confidence intervals, analysis must account for the sampling design. Although geared towards states and territories, the techniques are appropriate for other jurisdictions such as counties.

Using Oral Health Data to Inform Decisions and Policy Development

This document provides tips for the use and presentation of complex oral health data so that the information is understandable and meaningful for a non-dental audience. It also provides a list of resources ranging from a communications toolkit to developing a "plain English" document.

State Data/Surveillance Template

This tool is an editable MSWord document that provides links to online data sources with state and national estimates for key oral health indicators, including those from NOHSS and *Healthy People 2010*. Links are provided to national data systems where state data may be found. Information is also provided on state programs or contacts that typically have the listed oral health data. States can modify this document to create a personalized template, adding indicators and links to additional state and local data sources more current or available through collaboration with state and local partners.

ASTDD Oral Health Assessment 7 Step Model

Needs assessment is not an end in itself, but the initial step in the development of a comprehensive oral health program plan. This document has been created to make needs assessment simpler and more manageable. It serves as a step-by-step guide that can be adapted to specific community resources and objectives.
