## **Key Oral Health Messages**

- Limit foods and drinks with added sugar
- Drink water throughout the day
- Brush with fluoride toothpaste twice a day
- Get a dental visit by age 1

#### **Suggested Activities for DHLs**

Offer ideas for celebrating NCDHM with programs before January 31

#### Suggested Activities for Head Start Program Staff

- Plan at least one oral health activity for each week in February
- Include oral health message in family newsletter(s) and social media outlets





#### **Message: Limit Sugar to Prevent Tooth Decay**

- Engaging Staff
  - Serve healthy foods and drinks at events
  - Have staff participate in "limiting sugar" activity
  - Share <u>Brush Up on Oral Health</u>, <u>Understanding How Sugar Contributes to</u> <u>Tooth Decay</u> tip sheet
- Engaging Parents
  - Encourage parents to use <u>Cook's Corner: Recipes for Healthy Snacks</u>
  - Share guidelines on <u>fruit juice</u>
  - Offer examples of non-food-related rewards (hugs, kind words, stickers, special activities)
  - Show <u>Sesame Street in Communities</u>, <u>Tooth-Friendly Foods</u> video

#### Message: Drink Water Throughout the Day

- Engaging Staff
  - Read the book or show the video, <u>Potter the Otter: A Tale About Water</u>
  - Set up a water station in the classroom
  - Be a good role model and drink water instead of beverages with natural or added sugar
- Engaging Parents
  - Share <u>Healthy Habits for Happy Smiles</u>, *Encouraging Your Child to Drink Water* tip sheet
  - Encourage parents to serve children drinks from fruit-infused water recipes instead of beverages with added sugar

#### Message: Brush with Fluoride Toothpaste Twice a Day


- Engaging Staff
  - Show <u>Steps for Toothbrushing at the Table</u> video
  - Create a social media campaign using the oral health social media toolkit
  - Use the <u>Checklist for Child Care Staff: Best Practices for Good Oral Health</u> to set goals to improve oral health related program practices

#### Engaging Parents

- Promote the <u>Brush, Book, Bed</u> program to help parents structure a nighttime routine that includes toothbrushing
- Remind parents to brush their child's teeth with fluoride toothpaste
- Encourage parents to model good oral hygiene practices
- Show Sesame Street in Communities, Brushy Book Nighty Night video











# Final Rule on Mitigating the Spread of COVID-19 in Head Start Programs

- Final Rule effective January 6, 2023
- Removes requirement of universal masking for all individuals ages 2 and older
- Requires Head Start programs to develop an evidencebased COVID-19 mitigation policy developed in consultation with Health Services Advisory Committee by March 7, 2023
- The policy can be scaled up or down based on the impacts on or risks of COVID-19 in the community



  - Share the following Healthy Habits for Happy Smiles handouts
    - Finding a Dental Clinic for Your Child
    - Getting Oral Health Treatment Is Important
  - Share <u>Coronavirus Disease and Oral Health: Information for Parents about Visiting</u> <u>the Dental Office</u> handout to reassure parents that dental visits are safe
  - Show <u>Sesame Street in Communities</u>, <u>Starting Early</u> video
